Introduction

In its [SME Strategy](#) of March 2020, the Commission announced an **initiative on short-term accommodation rental services**. The Commission's Staff Working Document (SWD(2021) 164 final) proposes scenarios towards the co-creation of a [transition pathway](#) for a more resilient, innovative and sustainable tourism ecosystem. This document mentions a possible legislative proposal for improving the framework for short-term accommodation rental services ('STR') among other actions to be explored.

STR refers to the **provision of accommodation, typically on a daily or weekly basis, principally for short stays by visitors. The accommodation can take the form of a furnished room or an entire apartment or house, with possible access to other facilities and services.** Hotels and campsites are not considered [STRs](#).

STR have grown in recent years as an alternative offer to **more traditional accommodation such as hotels or campsites**. STRs may be offered by **private individuals on an occasional basis ('peers')**, but STRs can also be provided more **professionally**, for example by businesses using property bought for this purpose specifically or individuals who make the property available on a regular basis. **Online booking platforms** play a key role in connecting hosts and guests across the EU, and STRs are supported by a growing number of providers of various services, such as **management, reception and cleaning services**. STR have created new opportunities for hosts, guests and a range of new service providers, most of which are SMEs. However, the rapid growth of the STR segment has also given rise to **concerns** related to the sustainable development of cities, consumer safety and level regulatory playing field.

Many authorities across the EU have taken initiatives to regulate STRs. They have imposed requirements such as **registration** and **authorisation** schemes on hosts, and have imposed restrictions such as **limitations** on the number of nights per year properties can be rented out. Whilst doing so, some national rules make a difference between so-called '**peers**' offering STRs in a private capacity occasionally, and those offering STRs in a more **professional** capacity. Criteria differ however and not everywhere a distinction is made between peers and professionals. Authorities have also taken a variety of measures to **obtain better data** from platforms, with a view to better assessing the volume of STRs and facilitating law enforcement.

The foregoing has resulted in a [patchwork of varying rules and regulations](#).

Under EU law, imposing restrictions and conditions on the provision of a service can be justified if necessary to pursue a legitimate public interest objective and proportionate to achieve that end. In spite of important clarifications offered by EU case law, there is still much uncertainty regarding the measures authorities may adopt and enforce as regards hosts and other service providers such as platforms.

EU horizontal regulatory initiatives such as the Digital Services Act aim to impose harmonised obligations on online platforms, including collaborative economy platforms in the area of STRs. However, in order to foster a balanced development of the STR segment in the EU and to address the sector-specific aspects, a dedicated sector-specific initiative may be needed.

The Commission is initiating a process for analysing and collecting evidence, as well as a stakeholder consultation for identifying whether there are issues that would benefit from intervention by the EU. This consultation covers a series of topics related to the environment of STR and aims to consult all types of stakeholders about challenges in this sector as well as possible measures to address these challenges. The consultation contains questions grouped in four thematic parts:

1. General market information
2. Issues related to transparency
3. Issues related to market access restrictions
4. Any other issues

II. Issues related to transparency

The STR segment is characterised by a lack of transparency. Online booking platforms often have data on STRs but, except in the field of [taxation](#), do not share it on a systematic and consistent basis with public authorities across the EU.

This is often due to, amongst others, uncertainty regarding the applicable rules, lack of consistent and systematic requests from public authorities and privacy concerns. Public authorities find it difficult, to assess the exact volume of STRs; in addition, law enforcement is rendered difficult where authorities are not in a position to assess who rents out what.

To address a lack of transparency, many authorities have started putting in place registration schemes for hosts. Such schemes may be combined with other requirements and arrangements designed to gather information and data, notably from platforms.

Online booking platforms, for their part, have entered into voluntary arrangements, notably with Eurostat, which is collecting [statistical data on STRs](#), and with certain cities/Member States. Such arrangements have contributed to more transparency but may not address all needs.

This module will gather information on what type of data on short-term rentals might be needed and why, what data is currently obtained and the means by which it is shared. Data can be non-personal data (i.e. aggregated and anonymised) or personal data (e.g. identity of hosts, address of the accommodation being rented out).
